Commodore's Comments

Please let me thank you for all the positive feedback the Committee have received recently regarding the initiatives we have undertaken and propose for the club; we are in a rebuilding phase, not just facilities wise but membership focus is a priority.

Following Warren Matheson's wonderful display at the Bendigo Show of a selection of yachts and our rescue boat, we have received great feedback and a number of enquiries. Warren undertook a huge task organising this event, he was assisted by members and Committee who were in attendance "spruiking" on the day, handing out flyers and answering questions about the club and sailing in general. Thank you for your ongoing hard work and focus on the long term future of our club.

Now some housekeeping; a meeting was held at the club rooms on the ongoing service to members by the canteen. In recent times you will be aware that we have been very dependent upon a few loyal dedicated members for its operation. As with all things, we must share the responsibility for manning this facility to ensure that it can continue as a service to members.

As such, the canteen roster is now incorporated into the Sailing Committee Duty Roster; which means, when you are rostered on duty, the Canteen will be one of the duties to be covered. In addition, there is always the need for extra hands who can spend some time assisting there.

If you would like to learn how to operate the coffee machine in the canteen please let me know, I will be happy to run you through the process. It's very simple, if I can do it anyone can.

Also another duty that has been completed by canteen staff in the past is the baskets for Start and Rescue boats. There has been a change in this process; if you are going on the Start or Rescue boats, wish to take a basket of the usual refreshments please come to the canteen, you will be responsible for the packing of the baskets to take with you when you head out.

Our cleaner comes to the club weekly to clean through the entire building. In order for this to be done the chairs in the common room are required to be placed on the table tops to ensure no obstacles are in the way. May I ask you please when leaving the club on Saturday afternoon after sailing that you assist by putting the chairs on the tables. This is not a task that takes a lot of time but has been a task undertaken by the canteen volunteers until now. Many hands make light work.

Our new outdoor kitchen is due to commence this weekend with the assistance of members under the guidance of Ron Mason and Phil Mann. We are thankful to Colin Nankervis who is also very involved in this project, not only in the planning stage but his assistance in the coordination of the refurb.

You will have received by now an email with details of this project and our request for assistance. Ideally we are looking for some members who have time to spare on either Saturday, Sunday or during weekdays who can help out. Ron Mason will be very pleased to hear from you if you can help out.

You may notice that Bendigo Yacht Club Shirts and hats are for sale at reduced cost. These can be seen on the rack beside the children's corner of the common room. If you wish to purchase any of these items, please see Anita Hunter who will be happy to "fit you out".

Enjoy the warmer weather and all the joy it brings.



Manager's Report Buildings & Grounds - Ron Mason

Thanks to a wonderfully attended working bee we are well advanced to completing the backlog of maintenance work at the club. We have another working bee scheduled for later in the sailing season, all members will again be notified of the proposed date.

There is always something that needs to be done at the club. At the moment there are plenty of weeds that can be whipper snipped or poisoned, and grass always needs mowing at this time of year.

The club has many tools and equipment stored in the garden shed that members are very welcome to become acquainted with. Of course members are encouraged to bring along their own tools. We also encourage all members to wear the appropriate personal protective equipment and to carry out tasks in a manner that is safe to themselves and to others.

Maintenance Request form.

There is a proforma of the maintenance request form available on the club's website. Any member who would like maintenance tasks attended to or would like to report a problem or issue that needs attention can print the form, fill it in and scan it and email it to the club or to me at <u>masonfamily@westnet.com.au</u> or print it out and deliver it to the club. An electronic version of the form will be made available shortly.

Hard copies of the form will also be available at the club.

New building works.

The club is about to embark on the proposed new outdoor kitchen which is the start of the planned club refurbishment. The planned work does not lend itself to a major working bee so initially we would like to organize any available members into small working groups to help with the building of the outdoor kitchen.

Ideally if we could get four to six members who might have some hours to spare either Saturday or Sunday morning or even during the week, that would be very much appreciated. The groups will be overseen by either myself or Phil Mann or somebody designated for that task.

All members will be emailed by the Commodore seeking their support and can simply reply to the email with details of when they are available. I will then create a roster and advise members when they are due to participate.

Broadly, the tasks involved in the outdoor kitchen project will include:

Digging foundations, pouring concrete, timber framing, wall cladding, fixing plaster and painting.

With winds gusting up to 30 knots on Saturday 15th October there were quite a few tales to tell from sailors who braved the elements. Thanks Russ for a great report.

The Great Race - Eppalock Style.

Well our first trophy race for the season has been and gone and wow, was it a lot of fun. Our OOD, Rowan Gillies thought it would be a good opportunity to sail around the island, something we haven't been able to do for some time, and we were all very excited at the chance to do so. It's days such as this we can try a few things different to mix our sailing up a bit for fun and good competition and Rowan managed to supply a course that fulfilled both.

It was a beautiful day out at the club with a good breeze and plenty of sunshine with the added bonus of the rigging area being beautiful grass. What a change from last year. As it was such a splendid day I thought a rash top was more than adequate for conditions, naturally over the life jacket. This proved to be a bit silly but more on this later.

About ten boats signed on for the race but as it got closer to start time the breeze began to freshen and on checking with the weather station at the airport we found it was blowing 26 knot gusts, however it was nothing like this as yet at Eppalock so we set off. Soon after though it did begin to get a bit challenging with a few competitors getting into a bit of strife prior to the start however most did make it and we set off for our tour around the island. The Hunter boys were having plenty of fun reaching back and forth near the club on the Pacer which looked great. They waved us goodbye as we raced away. John Scott and Geoff decided to stay on shore but someone should have told them boats need to be on a trailer before removing them from the water. Sailing up the boat ramp probably didn't get them very far. I'm sorry but I didn't see anyone else as quite honestly we all had a bit on in controlling our boats.

It was a great reach to the first mark and an even better one when we cracked off and headed for the point of the island. I was a bit worried about the new rig on the Impulse but it was a good test and it held together OK although flexing all over the place. I managed to hold on closely followed by Bernie on his Sabre and Hugh and Alyssa on their Lasers. As it was getting more windy it's a bit hard to recall but I'm sure Rob and Judy Heath were also close by.

The downwind behind the island wasn't too eventful but trying to surf the waves was a bit of fun and seeing the water so high was very pleasing. Remember my attire I chose for the day? Well here is where it got a bit under done as when we rounded the bottom of the island the wind had increased significantly and big waves were the result. You can imagine how cold I was punching into these waves with them breaking over the boat and myself. In fact I was so cold and it was so windy I thought about going in after the first windward and return set as part of the afternoons course. Watching Alyssa, Bernie and Hugh sailing so well in these very difficult conditions inspired me to carry on, but I did have mixed emotions as I watched some of the gusts almost flatten Rob and Judy. Here is where I must admit I'm a chicken. Due to not being able to bear away at the top mark and having to wait for the gust to blow over before I could continue I decided not to gybe for the rest of the race rather than choose to "granny tack". This worked out quite well as I didn't go swimming but watching Bernie screaming down wind, throwing in a perfect gybe and passing me was both thrilling to watch but very humbling at the same time. In fact I watched some great boat handling on the day both during the race, before and after. Each and everyone who set off on the day should be very proud of their efforts and I hope everyone had as much fun as I did.

A great day, well run and well attended. I would encourage those members who don't take advantage of trophy days and something a bit different to give it a try as I'm sure you won't be disappointed.


